

Dear People of God,

The Gospel of John was the favorite of Celtic Christians (Christians who lived in Ireland, Scotland, Wales, Cornwall, The Isle of Mann, Brittany—in France, and in Galicia—in Northwest Spain). Why? Why were these Christians so drawn to John's gospel in particular? There may be many reasons, but I suggest they include the following:

- 1) John is called "The beloved disciple"—i.e. he is the one who, at the Last Supper, "was reclining close to" or "leaning on Jesus' breast" (John 13:23). The Celts said that meant John had literally heard the heartbeat of God! For, John wrote, that Jesus was "The Word of God made flesh" (John 1:14a).
- What does one who "heard the heartbeat of God" have to reveal to us about Jesus? In many ways John presents the most human Jesus— and the most divine! John really wrestles with taking incarnation seriously. In John's Gospel "Jesus wept" (11:35) and on the cross, Jesus cried out, "I thirst" (19:28). Jesus is fully human and hallows human "flesh" (1:14a). And Jesus is divine: "all things came into being through him" and "in him was life and the light of all people" (1:3-4). Jesus is "God's child, full of grace and truth" (vs. 14b). Humanity and divinity are not at odds, but held together in love.
- 3) Jesus' promises that same love and integration for us. "God so loved the world." (John 3:16). We are also "children of God" (1:12), "born from above" (3:3), "Beloved" (I John 2:7). From "This fulness of Christ we have all received grace upon grace." (1:16). "I came that you may have life, and have it abundantly" (10:10), "that my joy may be in you and your joy may be full." The Celts embraced this "fulness" of life or wholeness in the holding together of life's seeming extremes or opposites: "light and darkness"; "sun and moon"; "sea and sky"; "heaven and earth"; "forgiveness and sin"; "brokenness and healing": "blindness and sight": "laughter and tears": "flesh and spirit"; "life and death ... and eternal life"! Christ Crucified and Risen is "the Lord of the Dance!"



And "faith" in the gospel of John is a journey. It's a verb not a noun. It's not either/or—i.e. either we have faith or we don't. In John's gospel people are continually "coming to believe". We can have questions and doubts. We can be uncertain and afraid. And Jesus meets us where we are. No where is the truth of this grace more profoundly revealed than in the resurrection story told only in John: the story of "Thomas", who was not present on the first Easter and declared, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands and put my finger in the mark and my hand in the wound in his side, I will not believe" (John 20:25). So what did Jesus do? Met Thomas in his need, came to Thomas and said, "Peace be with you. Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out and touch my side. Do not doubt, but believe." (vss. 25-27). "My Lord and my God", Thomas came to say (vs. 28). And realize, in John's gospel, the Risen Christ still has his wounds. Jesus is "Wounded Lord"— another one of these seeming extremes or opposites held together... and Jesus is holding our woundedness and our suffering with great empathy and love... until the victory is also ours...and Christ is freeing us to embrace all wounds and suffering in the world with love that overcomes.



This is the Christ of the Celts! Will you follow? That's our theme and series for this Lenten Season as we read from the Gospel of John: "Following Christ of the Celts". I hope to see you in Worship on Sundays, Soup Suppers and at mid week Lenten Services on Wednesdays. Don't miss our celebration of St. Patrick—the best known Celtic follower of Christ—on Sunday, March 11th at 9am and 11:15am when our special musical guests will be the Celtic band, "Mrs. Doyle and the Teapots!" Then there's the Irish Potato Bar and "Over the Rainbow" Auction in the evening on March 11th—a fundraiser for our youth to go to camp. Holy week begins with Palm Sunday on March 25th and we celebrate Easter on April 1st—April Fools Day—but then in the early church, St. John of Chrysostom (347-407AD) envisioned the Risen Christ laughing on Easter, that the Resurrection was God's best joke, pulled on Satan and all the powers of evil! The Celts envisioned Christ dancing on Easter— "The Lord of the Dance!" Come celebrate with joy the Love that overcomes!

Congregational Meeting Sunday April 15th at 11:15 am

Right now our program year follows the school year—from September through early June. Then are summer activities. We have our annual stewardship program in the fall, when we pledge for giving in the next calendar year. Pledges go from January to December. And our Budget or Fiscal year goes from May 1st to April 30th with our annual congregational meeting in mid May.

Your leaders think it would be a good idea if the program year, pledging and our budget were all aligned—followed the same calendar. We also think it makes sense to follow the program year or school year. The Leadership Board recommends our Budget Year be changed to Oct. 1 through Sept 30th. To do that requires a congregational vote and we will meet on April 15th (after one service at 10am) for the sole purpose of voting on this change.

There will be forums on Sundays, March 18th and April 8th, for you to ask questions and share comments about the proposed change.

If approved, we will extend the current budget and the terms of officers and Leadership Board members until a congregational meeting in September to adopt a new budget, hold elections, and make our pledges for giving. The Congregation has already been asked to continue their current pledges and level of giving from 2017 until the fall of 2018. Make sense? (if not—that's what the Forums are for!).




